Career and College Readiness Corner

In the spring of 2019, Manitou Springs High School expanded its Computer Science Pathway by adding classes. The pathway is now an approved Career and Technical Education (CTE) pathway and students participated in Advanced Placement (AP) testing for the first time.

In the spring AP testing session, 100 percent of the Computer Science Principles students scored a 3 or higher, which allows them to earn college credit.
