Career and College Readiness Corner

There are a lot of acronyms and new terminology in education these days. and that includes career and college readiness. Over the next three weeks, we will shed some light on three of the programs we are offering and working on offering at Manitou Springs High School. These include: AP – Advanced Placement, CE – Concurrent Enrollment and Articulation. This week we will start with Articulation.

Articulation is offered through Pikes Peak Community College and is often associated with an AAS, or Applied Associates of Science degree, but can also be applied in some cases to an Assoicates of Arts degree or certification program. We have been working with

PPCC to offer these articulated credits in the following pathways:

- · Computer Science: Microsoft Office Suites class
- Health Sciences: Med Terms
- · Construction: PACTS curriculum
- Theatre: Tech Theatre
- · Commercial Arts: Photography, Printmaking and Metalsmithing

We are hoping to have all of these programs in place and have students earning college credit for the 2020-21 school year.

This program allows for students to move ahead in a program while in high school with very little cost and to complete their career pathway and enter the workforce at an earlier age.
